The **7 continents of the world** are:- Asia Africa

The **5 oceans** are the Pacific, Atlantic, Southern, Arctic and Indian oceans.

The **Equator is an imaginary line** that separates the earth into the Northern hemisphere and the Southern hemisphere.

There are **2 polar regions** to the north and south of the planet.

The temperature around the equator is hot.

It is cold around the poles.

Life around the 2 polar regions are different from life around the equator.


Animals such as the beluga whale, arctic foxes and some seals live in the colder regions and animals such as snakes, big cats and primates live in warmer regions.


We can use a temperature atlas to locate where the hot and cold countries of the world can be found.

Polar Regions	Regions that cover the top and bottom of the planet earth.
Equator	A imaginary line that divides the world into 2 halves - top and bottom.
Hemisphere	When the world is divided into 2 equal parts.
